Paint your own set of Lungs

You will need:



dishwashing sponge



paint



paper

marker pen



Instructions:

- 1. Draw a set of lungs or print out the outline.
- 2. Place paint in a dish, dip your sponge into the paint and gently dab on to the lungs. Continue until you have sponge painted both lungs. Leave to dry.
- 3. Use your marker pens to draw on the bronchiole and alveolus.
- 4. Place these labels onto your diagram:



Lung:

You have two! There is one on your left side and one on your right side.

Trachea (pronounced track-ee-a):

This 'pipe' connects your mouth and nose to your lungs. It supplies air to the lungs as we breathe in and lets air out as we breathe out.

Bronchus (pronounced bron-kus):

You have two smaller 'pipes' that connect the big trachea to each lung - one on the left side and one on the right side.



Alveoli (pronounced al-vee-o-lie):

These are the little air 'bubbles' or sacs in the lungs. If you have used the sponge to paint the lungs, you can label the little circles made in the paint 'alveoli' or you can draw lots of little circles in the lungs and label them.
